### Martin W. Essex School for the Gifted

The Martin W. Essex School for the Gifted offers Ohio's top students a unique opportunity to broaden their vision of the future. The school was founded in 1976 and named for Dr. Martin W. Essex, Ohio's superintendent of public instruction from 1966-1976. Now, in its third decade, this one-week residential program emphasizes leadership and social responsibility for students of exceptional abilities.

# The Nomination & Selection Process:

- Teachers, guidance counselors, and administrators may nominate two students per school for the Essex School for the Gifted.
- Students must be in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Students must be identified as gifted and talented (reference high school identification list) and should be academically motivated.
- Students should show strength in scholarship, leadership, and social responsibility.
- District and state selection committees evaluate student essays and teacher recommendations searching for exceptional responses and strong recommendations.



## **Student Expectations**

## Student nominees are expected to do the following:

- Write one 150-word short response describing an accomplishment, activity, or skill that sets you apart from your classmates
- Write one 500-word essay explaining how a person, item, or event has influenced your life and why he/she/it is important to you (or revise and edit a personal refection composition with comparable content).
- Find two teachers who will write excellent letters of recommendation for you and complete the recommendation forms.
  - (Be sure to write thank you cards!)
- Complete all sections of the application and return them to your sponsor by

- January 19, 2009 (the teacher or guidance counselor who nominated you) with another big thank you.
- Your sponsor will forward your application on to the Gifted and Talented Department by January 23, 2009.

#### 2008-2009 Essex Timeline

#### Mid-December:

- ✓ Applications sent to 11<sup>th</sup>grade counselors and English Department Chairs and available for download.
- ✓ Students selected as nominees or enter school competition.
- Students write essays or revise personal reflections from writing portfolios.
- ✓ Students request teacher recommendations.
- Teachers write recommendation letters. They are not supposed to fill in forms-these are guides.

#### January:

- ✓ Students revise and edit essays.
- Teachers submit recommendations to sponsors or students in sealed, signed envelopes.
- ✓ Sponsors send completed applications to Shepard Center for District Competition by January 23, 2009.
- ✓ Essex Review Panel meets January 26, 2009 to select top 7 district nominees.
- Top 7 selected applications submitted to superintendent on January 29, 2009.
- ✓ Top 7 submitted to State Competition.

#### March or April:

✓ Finalists announced.


#### May:
