Success in College and Life: A Professor's Perspective



Even talented students often struggle in the transition to college, and many students do not make the best of the opportunities at the university level. What distinguishes a “good” college experience from a “bad” one? What are some strategies for making the most of a college education? How can college be used as a springboard to success in graduate school and life? We’ll tackle all of these questions.

Jonathan Plucker is the Julian C. Stanley Endowed Professor of Talent Development at Johns Hopkins University, where he works in the School of Education and Center for Talented Youth. His research examines education policy and talent development, with over 200 publications to his credit. His books include *Critical Issues and Practices in Gifted Education*, *Intelligence 101*, and *Essentials of Creativity Assessment*. Prof. Plucker has worked on projects involving educators, schools, and students in all 50 states and several countries and he is a recipient of the Distinguished Scholar Award from NAGC.
